

Register on Covid-19 video podcast: A Sociolinguistics Study

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Abstract

Register is a variety of languages based on its use, the language that is used depends on what being done and the nature activities. Language used by people in social media seems to use a register because it has different variety from others and has particular characteristics used only by them who involved. This research aims to identify the type of register used in the covid-19 video podcasts and to analyze the most dominant type of register that used in the covid-19 video podcasts. In conducting this research, the researcher used qualitative design in content analysis approach. The data in this research was the utterances between the speakers in the covid-19 video podcasts. This research used theory from Finch (2000) about the types of the register in the conversation of covid-19 video podcast. The researcher finds three types of register that used in the covid-19 video podcast entitled "Covid-19 Vaccine Update and Covid-19 Vaccinations Happening in Phase". They are formal register, casual register and consultative register. Meanwhile, in the first and the second video, the types of register that most dominant used is consultative register. In the first video, consultative register consists of 8 data. While in the second video, consultative register consists of 5 data. In brief, the types of register that most used is consultative register. It happens because the video podcasts aim to educate people about covid-19 especially in vaccination. The consultative register occurs in small group discussion that discussed about covid-19.

Abstrak

Register adalah ragam bahasa berdasarkan penggunaannya, bahasa yang digunakan tergantung pada apa yang dilakukan dan sifat kegiatannya. Bahasa yang digunakan oleh orang-orang di media sosial tampaknya menggunakan register karena memiliki variasi yang berbeda dari yang lain dan memiliki karakteristik khusus yang hanya digunakan oleh mereka yang terlibat. Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk mengidentifikasi jenis register yang digunakan pada video podcast covid-19 dan menganalisis jenis register yang paling dominan digunakan pada video podcast covid-19. Dalam melakukan penelitian ini, peneliti menggunakan desain kualitatif dengan pendekatan analisis isi. Data dalam penelitian ini adalah tuturan antar pembicara dalam podcast video covid-19. Penelitian ini menggunakan teori dari Finch (2000) tentang jenis-jenis register dalam percakapan podcast video covid-19. Peneliti menemukan tiga jenis register yang digunakan dalam video podcast covid-19 berjudul "Covid-19 Vaccine Update and Covid-19 Vaccinations Happening in Phase". Mereka adalah register formal, register kasual dan register konsultatif.

Sedangkan pada video pertama dan kedua, jenis register yang paling dominan digunakan adalah register konsultatif. Pada video pertama, register konsultatif terdiri dari 8 data. Sedangkan pada video kedua, register konsultatif terdiri dari 5 data. Secara singkat, jenis register yang paling banyak digunakan adalah register konsultatif. Hal itu terjadi karena video podcast bertujuan untuk mengedukasi masyarakat tentang covid-19 khususnya dalam hal vaksinasi. Register konsultatif terjadi dalam diskusi kelompok kecil yang membahas tentang covid-19.

Introduction

Language used by people in social media seems to use a register because it has different variety from others and has particular characteristics used only by them who involved. Holmes (2013: 262) states that the term register here describes a language that is contextually used in relation to the language or group of people of the same interest or profession. People use a variety of languages to describe changing context factors such as society's address, settings, and topics. Each profession or social group has certain differences in the vocabulary involved. According to Holmes (2013:1) "The way people talk is influenced by the social context in which they are talking". It involves who can hear us and where we are talking, as well as how we are feeling toward our interlocutor. We can see register in social life that we often encounter. For example, register in conversation between people who talk in a podcast.

These days, many people use social media to communicate with each other. Social media is a technology widely used by people around the world, from child to adult. Registers can be found in social media as like video podcast. Video podcast is a video file, which is one of the most universally compatible video formats on the market Richard (2008:26). Video podcasts is a tool to convey various information, ideas, statements and others. The use of language in the video podcast has a variety of languages especially register. It aims to be more attract audience attention to what is informed. Video podcast has various themes that are presented such as music, lifestyle, art, and world of health. One of a theme about world of health is covid-19 disease.

As we know at the beginning of 2020, the world was shocked by a new virus called corona virus. The virus has invaded all over the world. Zein (2020: 13) states that covid-19 is a large group viruses that causes disease ranging from common cold cough to more disease serious. The most

common symptoms of covid-19 are fever, fatigue, and dry cough. Some patients experience pain throat, stuffy nose, runny nose, and diarrhea. Covid-19 as a world disaster that really poses fear and threat to people human survival. We are not just living in a public health crisis, but an economic downturn as well. It has spread rapidly too many countries including Indonesia. See what happened today's situation that many countries regulated several activities as prevention efforts against the spread of the virus such as travel restrictions, national quarantines, curfews, event delays and cancellations, and some city facilities are closed. In humans, the corona virus causes mild to fatal respiratory infections. Minor illnesses such as some cases of the common cold, and more deadly strains that can cause SARS, MERS, and, COVID-19.

In this digital era, we can find the information about corona virus in video podcast. However, not all video podcasts provide the accurate information. There are kinds of videos that provide information about the covid-19 vaccination in the community. One of the video podcast with the theme of covid-19 that provide accurate information is Mayo Clinic video podcast. Mayo clinic podcast is a weekly podcast hosted by Helena Gazelka, M.D., a medical director at the Mayo Clinic. The speaker in this podcast is Gregory Poland, M.D., an American doctor and vaccinator he is the Mary Lowell Leary professor of medicine at the Mayo Clinic Vaccine Research Group. The researcher chooses the video podcast because video podcast is one of the most popular channels in social media. The researcher uses the video podcast from Mayo & Clinic Podcast because the video talks about covid-19 disease and the speaker of the video was taken from the expert of covid-19.

There are some researchers who have analyzed language variation in term of uses called by register. The first is Yanti's research (2019) entitled An Analysis of Register in the Conversation of Police Members of Gowa Police Resort. Yanti's research only focuses on types and the function of register in the conversation of traffic unit members of Gowa police resort. The second research conducts by Jannah (2015) entitled Language Register on Instant Messaging. Jannah's research only focuses on the forms of register on Instant Messaging and how are the uses of Instant Messaging in term of gender and age. The third research is Yulianto's research (2014) entitled A Study of Register Used in "Downy Runway Dreams" Movie: A Focus Fashion World. Yulianto's research focuses on the use of register based on words and phrase, and the factor influence the use

of register. The last research is Kartika's research (2018) entitled "Register in *Persaudaraan Setia hati*: Sociolinguistics Study" In her research, she aims to analyze the form of registers. Different from those previous studies, this research focuses on the type of register and the most dominant type of register used on covid-19 video podcast.

The researcher chooses "Register on Covid-19 Video Podcast: A Sociolinguistics Study" as the title of the research because the variety of language is unique to be analyzed. Language has its own characteristic which is different in each field. This research can increase the knowledge of student especially at English Department students who are interested in sociolinguistics and be able to apply their knowledge and comprehend language variation about register. The researcher also wants to make the reader know how serious the covid-19 in this covid-19 pandemic situation. The researcher wants the reader aware of doing something that has been determined by the government.

Methodology

In this research the researcher used qualitative research design in content analysis approach. According to Creswell (2018:41) Qualitative research is an approach for exploring and understanding the meaning individuals or groups ascribe to a social or human problem. The process of research involves emerging questions and procedures, data typically collected in the participant's setting, data analysis inductively building from particulars to general themes, and the researcher making interpretations of the meaning of the data.

Content analysis can be said as a type of research approach in qualitative research that aims to analyze the material. Ary (2009: 29) states that content analysis focuses on analyzing and interpreting recorded material to learn. The material may be films, public records, textbooks or another document. The use of this design is related to the research objectives namely identifying the type of register used in the covid-19 video podcast and analyzing the most dominant type of register in the covid-19 video podcast.

In this research the instrument was documentation which is a video downloaded from YouTube. The data sources of this research were covid-19 video podcasts. The data source in this

research was taken from YouTube Mayo Clinic Q&A podcast with the first link is https://youtu.be/L617UYw_yZk and the second link is https://youtu.be/O4-oRJM_eFo .

Finding

In this part the researcher focuses on the findings to answer the research questions. This chapter presents the result of the data analysis.

1. Type of register used in the covid-19 video podcast

- *Covid-19 Vaccine Update* (the first video podcast)

a. Formal Register

Data 1 (D1,R1.1 V1) 00.00 - 00.09

Helena: **“Welcome everyone to Mayo clinic Q&A. I am Dr. Helena Gazelka. We are recording this podcast on December the 7th 2020.”**

D1.R1.1V1 shows that Helena uses right grammatical pattern in her utterances, such as: *“Welcome everyone to Mayo clinic Q&A. I am Dr. Helena Gazelka. We are recording this podcast on December the 7th 2020”*. The utterances come when she open the podcast to the audiences. The utterances come in formal situation and there is no feedback from the audiences. She also uses the natural intonation in the conversation. So, the utterance can be called as formal register

Data 2 (D2,R1.2.V1) 18:34-18:37

Helena: **“I hope that you learned something I know that I did and we wish you wonderful day”**

D1.R1.2.V1 in the utterance “*I hope that you learned something I know that I did and we wish you wonderful day*” shows that Helena close the podcast. She says that utterance to the audiences and there is no feedback from the audiences. She uses right grammatical pattern. She says the utterance in natural intonation. So she uses formal register.

b. Casual Register

Casual register is used among friends and coworkers when an informal atmosphere is appropriated and desired. The casual register is a register that is used as an easy conversation among friends. This register does not need well structured in the sentence. The utterances usually use contraction and repetition. Below are the data of casual register that used in the covid-19 video podcast entitled “Covid-19 Vaccine Update and covid-19 vaccinations happening in phase”*Covid-19 Vaccine Update* the first video podcast

Data 3 (D3,R2.1 V1) 00.11 - 00.12

Helena: “Here in the U.S plans are underway for vaccine distribution as covid-19 vaccines are nearing approval here as well. Well, today our favorite expert on vaccines is here to visit with us. Dr. Greg Poland returns. He is a Mayo clinic infectious disease expert, vaccine expert, and virologist. **Welcome back Greg**”

The utterance of D3,R2.1 V1 “Welcome back Greg” show that the utterance used among coworkers. The utterance comes in informal situation when Helena greets Greg. The utterance is not well grammatically structured. This register is shown with a conversation like a friend. So the utterance uses casual style.

Data 4 (D4.R2.2. V1) 00:37- 00:43

Greg: “**yeah, just very briefly and I have served on all of these committees.** So I have a pretty detailed knowledge of them. The

FDA has committee they call verpack. They're the ones that will review the data and make a recommendation to FDA.

The utterance of D4.R2.2. V1 *“yeah, just very briefly and I have served on all of these committees”* show that he uses interjection on his utterances. The utterance used among coworkers. The utterance comes in informal situation when Greg answers the question from Helena. The utterance is not well grammatically structured. This register is shown with a conversation like a friend. So the utterance uses casual style.

Data 5 (D5.R2.3.V1) 03:33-00:53

Greg: “Yeah, I mean I think we’re very fortunate Mayo clinic we’re ready there have been a lot of people putting a tremendous amount of time uh into thinking about this. So, so we’re ready that may not be true for other particularly more rural or smaller areas where the logistics and economics of it are, are difficult”

In the utterance D5.R2.3.V1 *“Yeah, I mean I think we’re very fortunate Mayo clinic we’re ready there have been a lot of people putting a tremendous amount of time uh into thinking about this. So, so we’re ready that may not be true for other particularly more rural or smaller areas where the logistics and economics of it are, are difficult”* show that he uses interjection and contraction. The utterance is not well grammatically. There is no conjunction in the utterance. So the utterance is casual register.

Data 6 (D6.R2.4.V1) 04:45-04:49

Greg: “**Right, right so that’s exactly true.** You can hold it in at refrigerator temperatures for few hours. Each vaccine is different.

In the utterance D6.R2.4.V1 *Right, right so that’s exactly true.* It shows that he uses repetition and contraction. The utterances come between coworkers in informal situation. He says the utterance in friendly intonation. So the sentence uses casual register.

Data 7 (D7.R2.5.V1) 00:42-00:44

Greg: “**Thank you. Good to be back**”

D10.R3.5.V1 In the utterance “*Thank you. Good to be back*” show that Greg uses friendly intonation to Helena. He says the utterance in clear pronunciation. This conversation occur among coworkers, Helena and Greg. So Greg uses casual register.

Data 8 (D8.R3.6.V1) 01:48 - 02:15

Greg: “yeah, just very briefly and I have served on all of these committees. So I have a pretty detailed knowledge of them. The FDA has committee they call verpack. They’re the ones that will review the data and make a recommendation to FDA. **Once FDA says yep this is a go and we anticipate the verpac meeting to be this Thursday.** Then it will go over to CDC. CDC has an advisory committee called the advisory committee on immunization practices ACIP as you mentioned. They’re responsible for the implementation phase of it.

D8.R3.6.V1 Greg answers the question from Helena. Greg says *Once FDA says yep this is a go and we anticipate the verpac meeting to be this Thursday.* The

utterance shows that he uses interjection and contraction. The utterance occurs between coworkers. So he uses casual register in the utterance

c. Consultative Register

The consultative register is used in conversation with a stranger and a small group in the discussion moment. The language used in consultative register completes grammatical form, major sentences, and core vocabulary items, slang, clear pronunciation, and friendly intonation. Below are the data of consultative register that used in the covid-19 video podcast entitled “Covid-19 Vaccine Update and covid-19 vaccinations happening in phase”

Data 9 (D9.R3.1.V1) 01:48 - 02:15

Greg: “yeah, just very briefly and I have served on all of these committees. So I have a pretty detailed knowledge of them. The FDA has committee they call verpack. **They’re the ones that will review the data and make a recommendation to FDA.** Once FDA says yep this is a go and we anticipate the verpac meeting to be this Thursday. Helena: “Frank, I saw a fascinating picture last week of some freezers that Mayo Clinic has obtained to store vaccine and **if I’m not incorrect they said that each of them can store about 45.000 doses of vaccine.**”

D10.R3.2.V1 the utterance *if I’m not incorrect they said that each of them can store about 45.000 doses of vaccine.*” Show that Helena uses the contraction in right grammatical pattern. In the conversation the pronunciation is very clear. Helena uses the utterance contains medical English vocabulary. So the utterance uses consultative register.

Data 11 (D11.R3.3.V1) 05:05-05:15

Greg: “Right, right so that’s exactly true. You can hold it in at refrigerator temperatures for few hours. Each vaccine is different. And then at room temperature for a very period of time in order to enable logistically actual immunization to occur. **So you know when you think about we’re going to start with the Pfizer so you can hold the Pfizer at refrigerator temperature for five days and at room temperature for about two hour.**”

D11.R3.3.V1in the utterance *“So you know when you think about we’re going to start with the Pfizer so you can hold the Pfizer at refrigerator temperature for five days and at room temperature for about two hour.”* Show that he uses good grammatical but he also uses the contraction. In the conversation, he

uses the utterance contains medical English vocabulary. He uses friendly intonation in the conversation. So the sentence uses consultative register.

Data 12 (D12.R3.4.V1) 07:29-07:35

Helena: **“Well, that um gave me a follow-up question for you that I’m sure some of our listeners might wonder as well. If you have those types of symptoms which sounds a little bit like coveted symptoms how do you know if you should go to work or if you should get tested for covid”**

D12.R3.4.V1 In the utterance *“Well, that um gave me a follow-up question for you that I’m sure some of our listeners might wonder as well”* show that she uses interjection and contraction in good grammatical pattern. In the conversation, she uses the utterance contains medical English vocabulary. She uses friendly intonation in the conversation. So the utterance uses consultative register.

Data 13 (D13.R3.5.V1) 07:

Greg: **“Yeah, this is a really practical question because particularly for the workplace. You don’t want to give everybody a vaccine all at once have confusion like that”**

D13.R3.5.V1 The utterance *“Yeah, this is a really practical question because particularly for the workplace. You don’t want to give everybody a vaccine all at once have confusion like that”* Show that he uses interjection in good grammatical pattern. The utteranceshow that he uses contraction in good

grammatical pattern. In the conversation, he uses medical English vocabulary. He uses friendly intonation in the conversation. So he uses consultative register in the conversation.

Data 14 (D14.R3.6.V1) 11:43- 11:46

Greg: **“You know and you’re very right about that and, and that makes adherence difficult doesn’t it?”**

D14.R3.6.V1 The utterance *“You know and you’re very right about that and, and that makes adherence difficult doesn’t it?”* show that the sentence use contraction. He also uses the repetition in the utterance. The utterance has good grammatical pattern. So the sentence is consultative register.

Data 15 (D15.R3.7.V1) 12:35-12:37

Helena: **“Wow, so that brings us again we’re still in the holiday season”**

D15.R3.7.V1 The utterance *“Wow, so that brings us again we’re still in the holiday season”* Show that the utterance use interjection and contraction in the conversation. She uses the utterance in good grammatical pattern. She uses friendly intonation in the conversation. So the sentence is consultative register.

Data 16 (D16.R3.8.V1) 13:11- 13:24

Greg: **“You know it’s a it’s a difficult public health and communication problem because the best recommendation to keep the most**

people the safest is do not travel do not gather even in small groups with people outside your family and your work”

D16.R3.8.V1 the utterance *You know it's a it's a difficult public health and communication problem because the best recommendation to keep the most people the safest is do not travel do not gather even in small groups with people outside your family and your work* show that the sentence use repetition and contraction in good grammatical. He uses the utterance contains medical English vocabulary. So the utterance is consultative register.

- *Covid-19 vaccinations happening in phase* (the second video podcast)

a. Formal Register

Data 17 (D17.R1.1.V2) 00:01- 00:05

Helena: **“Welcome everyone to our special holiday edition of Mayo clinic Q&A”**

The utterance D17.R1.1.V2 *“welcome everyone to our special holiday edition of Mayo clinic Q&A”* shows that Helena open the podcast to the audiences and there is no feedback from the audiences. She says the utterances in natural intonation. She uses right grammatical pattern in the conversation. So she uses formal register.

b. Casual register

Data 18 (D18.R2.1.V2) 07:19-07:3

Helena: **“so great and because I’ve um had this question repeated by colleagues and uh by listeners as well there is no concern that that genetic material that we're supplying to a vaccine could be incorporated into our own genetic material and change us permanently in any way”**

The utterance D18.R2.1.V2 *“so great and because I’ve um had this question repeated by colleagues and uh by listeners as well there is no concern that that genetic material that we're supplying to a vaccine could be incorporated into our own genetic material and change us permanently in any way”* show that Helena uses the contraction and repetition. The utterance is not good grammatically. The

utterances come between coworkers in informal situation. She says the utterance in friendly intonation. So in this sentence she uses casual register.

Data 19 (D8.R2.2.V2) 11:45-11:58

Helena: **“so just after we're celebrating that there are vaccines available there are all these news stories about the virus mutating and arising in different in a mutated form in different areas in Europe etc.** Can you tell us about that and are there concerns about this for the United States will the vaccines that we have work for this.

The utterance D8.R2.2.V2 *“so just after we're celebrating that there are vaccines available there are all these news stories about the virus mutating and arising in different in a mutated form in different areas in Europe etc”* show that Helena uses contraction. The utterance is not well grammatically. This register is shown with a conversation like a friend. So in this utterance Helena uses casual register.

Data 20 (D9.R2.3.V2) 18:20- 18:30

Greg: **“yeah you know this is this is the you know the actual practical operational difficulty of what sounds like a good plan”**

D20.R2.3.V2 In the utterance *“yeah you know this is this is the you know the actual practical operational difficulty of what sounds like a good*

plan” show that Greg uses interjection and repetition. The utterance comes between coworkers. The utterance is not good grammatical pattern. So Greg uses casual register.

Data 21 (D21.R2.4.V2) 14:23–14:25

Greg: “**yes yes this is this is great news**”

D21.R2.4.V2 In the utterance “*yes yes this is this is great news*” shows that Helena uses repetition. The utterance comes between coworkers. The utterance is not good grammatical pattern. So Greg uses casual register.

c. Consultative Register

Data 22 (D22.R3.1.V2) 00:23-00:0025

Helena: “welcome everyone to our special holiday edition of Mayo clinic Q&A. We're recording this podcast on December the 21st 2020 and I'm your host Dr. Helena Gazelka. Well in the last week the news has been filled of reports and photographs of healthcare workers receiving the first covid19 vaccine more vaccine should be available this week as another vaccine has been approved for emergency use authorization in the United States. we're excited to hear the updates about this today so let's get right jump right into it with our favorite uh co-host and guest to Dr. Greg Poland infectious disease and vaccine and virology expert at mayo clinic who's here to tell us.
What's going on in the world of covid vaccines?”

D22.R3.1.V2 In the utterance “*What's going on in the world of covid vaccines?*” show that Helena uses contraction in her utterance. She also uses the

utterance in the right grammatical pattern. She uses medical English vocabulary in the conversation. So the utterance uses consultative register.

Data 23 (D23.R3.2.V2) 00:47-00:50

Greg: **“Merry Christmas to you and to everybody who watches”**

D23.R3.2.V2 In the utterance “Merry Christmas to you and to everybody who watches” shows that Greg use utterance in right grammatical form. He speaks the utterance in friendly intonation. So Greg uses consultative register.

Data 24 (D23.R3.3.V2) 01:01-01:03

Helena: **“Yes I’m, I’m broadcasting from home today because I’m off this week.”**

D24.R3.3.V2 In the utterance *Yes I’m, I’m broadcasting from home today because I’m off this week* show that she uses repetition and contraction. The utterance is in right grammatical pattern. So the sentence is consultative register.

Data 25 (D25.R3.4.V2) 03:40-03:46

Helena: **“well it's wonderful that we're in a situation to begin considering that now and how to navigate that”**

D25.R3.4.V2 The utterance *“well it's wonderful that we're in a situation to begin considering that now and how to navigate that”* show that

Helena uses contraction in right grammatical sentence. So, Helena uses consultative register in her utterance.

Data 26 (D26.R3.5.V2) 04:04-04:07

Greg: “**yeah there's still some work to do with the *Astrazeneca* vaccine now**”

D26.R3.5.V2 The utterance “*yeah there's still some work to do with the Astrazeneca vaccine now*” show that Greg uses interjection and contraction in his utterances. He uses the right grammatical sentence in his utterances. He uses utterance contains medical English vocabulary. So Greg uses consultative register in his utterances.

Discussion

In this research, the objectives of this research are to identify the type of register that used in the covid-19 video podcast and to analyze the most dominant type of register on covid-19 video podcast. The findings of this study show that three types of register that used in the covid-19 video podcast entitled “Covid-19 Vaccine Update and Covid-19 Vaccinations Happening in Phase”. They are formal register, casual register and consultative register. This is in line with Finch’s theory (2000). Formal register is generally used in formal situation, where there is the least amount of shared background and the communication in this style is largely one way with little or no feedback from the audience. The features of this register are grammatically well formed, complex structure, simple vocabulary, and natural intonation. Casual register is used among friends and coworkers when an informal atmosphere is appropriated and desired. This register does not need well structured in the sentence. The utterances usually use contraction, repetition and limited expression. The consultative register is used in dialogue and conversation with a stranger and a small group in

the discussion moment. The language used in consultative register completes grammatical form, major sentences, and core vocabulary items, slang, clear pronunciation, and friendly intonation

In Yanti's research (2019), she found 4 types of register on her research. There are frozen, formal, consultative and casual register. In Fitriani's research (2020), she found 3 types of register they are frozen register, formal register, and consultative register. The most often register that existed in her study was formal consultative. It is because the content of the magazine that is used in her research provided many sentence which show formal register.

In this research, the researcher finds many consultative register. In the first video, consultative register consists of 9 data. While in the second video, consultative register consists of 5 data. In brief, the types of register that most used is consultative register. It happens because the video podcasts aim to educate people about covid-19 especially in vaccination. The consultative register occurs in small group discussion that discussed about covid-19.

. The type of register that rarely used in the first and second video is formal register. In the first video, the formal register consists of 2 data. For the second video, the formal register consists of 1 data. In brief, the type of formal register rarely used in the video because the context of formal register tends to be formal.

Conclusion

This research conducts to find the type of register that used in the covid-19 video podcast based on Finch's theory (2000)

1. The researcher finds three types of register that used in the covid-19 video podcast entitled "Covid-19 Vaccine Update and Covid-19 Vaccinations Happening in Phase". They are formal register, casual register and consultative register.
2. The most dominant type that used in the covid-19 video podcasts is Consultative register. In the first video, consultative register consists of 8 data. While in the second video, consultative register consists of 5 data. In brief, the types of register that most used is consultative register. It happens

because the video podcasts aim to educate people about covid-19 especially in vaccination. The consultative register occurs in small group discussion that discussed about covid-19.

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
